

Title of the	ABC OF THE NEW COUNTRY				
activity					
Description	Two flipchart sheets are prepared on which the ABC is written from top to bottom, so that you can put a word behind each letter. Rare letters like "Q", "X" and "Y" can be combined.				
	The sheets are attached to opposite walls. The group is divided into two teams, each group standing in the middle of the room facing one of the two flip chart sheets. Each team gets a marker.				
	Each group has to complete the letters on their own flipchart with a word that begins with that letter and has something to do with "the new country" (e.g. Germany). Participants take turns running to the flipchart, writing down a word, running back and passing the marker to another person in the group. The ABC has to be filled in the right order. The fastest group wins.

Why is this activity suitable for promoting civic participation and integration?	Participants can test their knowledge about "the new counrty" and learn something new about the country in a fun way.

Indication of duration of the activity	15-30 min					
Indication of preparation (time, which material are needed)	Up to 15 min Flipchart sheets on which the ABC is written					
Evaluation method (if applicable)	The class looks at both flipcharts together. Questions can be asked and unknown terms can be clarified.					
Variations (if applicable)	The group can be divided in more than two groups. Depending on the number of groups, more flipchart sheets are needed. The method does not need to be a competition. The groups can fill out the sheets at their own speed, without any rush. If the person whose turn it is can't think of a word, someone else in the group can help. Nevertheless, take care that everyone is involved. The method can be used for different topics. You can use it to make existing knowledge visible (e.g. to start a new topic in class) or to test the learning outcome at the end of a theme. Another variant: Choose one (key)word (example EUROPE) and choose a few categories to fill in. EXAMPLE:
