

Title of the activity	MAKING A CITY POSTER
Description	<p>The group creates a poster or a city map together. It is possible to expand existing maps (e.g. from the local tourist office) with pins, landmarks, post-its or flags The result can be hung up in the classroom.</p> <p>Leading questions:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Where are good places to spend your free time? • Where are the authorities located? • What places of interest are there? • Where are the participants' favourite places? • ...
Aims	Becoming familiar with the city/region
Main skills addressed	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Cooperation • Independency • Applying knowledge • Knowledge building
Why is this activity suitable for promoting civic participation and integration?	Getting to know the city/region
Type of activity	Outside the classroom, Teambuilding
Suitable for how many participants (min. / max.)	Small and large groups
Indication of duration of the activity	30 min – 1 hour

Indication of preparation (time, which material are needed)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Cardboard or paper (e.g. the blank side of flipchart paper) • Black and coloured pens • Scissors and glue/tape • stickers • printed photos and illustrations <p>Up to 15 min.</p>
Evaluation method (if applicable)	Let the participants visit some of the sights/places/locations they put on the map. Talk about the experience in class.
Variations (if applicable)	<p>Each participant makes their own map, let them discuss the results and let them add spots from the others on their own map.</p> <p>Participants can also research information about the places and exchange them in class.</p>
